PASTOR'S MESSAGE

VBS is here! VBS will be June 20th -24th. Vacation Bible School is a wonderful opportunity for us at FUPC. In Matthew 28·1-20 Jesus leaves us with a commandment, "16 Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Matthew ends his gospel with these last words of Jesus to his disciples. Jesus wants us to share the good news of the gospel. Jesus wants us to share the message that God loved us so much he sent his Son to die for our sins and raise from the dead so, we too, can experience eternal and everlasting life. The beauty of VBS is it is one of the simple and straightforward ways we, as Jesus'

disciples, can fulfill this commandment of our Lord. FUPC has another opportunity to share with God's children the good news of Jesus' love for us all.

The Presbyterian Church in its founding documents speaks of the "Great Ends of the Church". One of the great ends of the church is to proclaim the good news of the gospel. In VBS we are firmly rooted standing Presbyterian Heritage and honoring the command of our Master. The time for such teaching has never been more needed in our country. Evangelism is no longer something we do "over there". Sharing the good news of the gospel is no longer something we have to traverse sea and land to fulfill. As shocking as it might be, there are many of our young people who have not heard the good news of the gospel. The time is now and the place is here, for fulfilling Jesus command to share the good news about him.

Our VBS has traditionally served between 80-100 children each year. To





The office will continue to maintain a few bags of groceries in case of emergencies, and there are always opportunities to provide food baskets, or respond to those in need. Special offerings will be collected on behalf of the food pantry to provide for these special needs. Proceeds may also be donated to a local agency such as the Salvation Army, which has a greater capacity to feed Jesus' sheep.

Providing food is just one of many missions within the church and community. As "deacons", we are "servants" or "ministers" to the children of God. And the Deacons desire to have a greater impact in the lives of the congregation as we continue our service you. Watch for announcements for new initiatives.



All Over

Even though Marilyn and I were married in May, many others choose to marry during the month of June.

The Apostle Paul says marriage is an

illustration of the way Christ and the church are one. Every time a husband and wife stand before the altar and congregation to pledge their undying love, they are painting a picture of the way Christ loves his church. At the same time they are painting a picture of love, but it is not a picture of the emotional love we normally associate with weddings. It is much more the cognitive kind that is rooted mostly in your mind. This is sometimes difficult to understand, so what am I trying to describe?

There are at least 16 verbs in the Greek language that express the idea of love. One is phileo love which is brotherly love, and another is the kind of love we have for our brother or sister, or even a friend. There is eros. This is the type of love that is rooted in passionate desire. It is a purely physical attraction, and certainly there is much of this in the present day, especially in the early days

though of marriage, but a marriage that is built and I on eros, is eventually doomed to failure.

choose is agape love. This kind of love is not doomed for failure; instead it is the right kind of love. It is this love that is the love of God and is to be embraced in marriage. This is the kind of love we pledge in our wedding vows.

This is precisely what Jesus means when he gives his disciples their one and only commandment to "love one another." That is what the Apostle Paul means when he tells us to be clothed in love. That is what he means when he asks us to become one flesh, forever joined together.

We are the wedding gift that we give to one another. Our marriage is the gift, as we continue to give to one another every day. This is the decision we make, each and every day, and it is a shared love.

Remember that we cherish a true love each day of our lives, not just in the month of June and this is throughout eternity.






SEE YOU IN SEPTEMBER




What you need:
