# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

I have heard from many Christians, many good people say that they are nervous or at least unsettled when listening to national and international news. These days it seems to be all bad news. One of the things we must remember as Christians, the news should never define us. It should never shape us. The news should never be what we turn to for understanding. Jesus is the one we are to turn to for all of these and more, John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Jesus came to give us peace. Jesus came to give us a lasting and fulfilling peace. He came to give us his Spirit, John 14:16-17 "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever--the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you."

Paul writes about this in his letter to Timothy; 2 Timothy 1:7 " For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline." When Jesus promised his apostles peace at the last supper, they were an occupied

people under the rule of Rome and would be persecuted by Rome and even their own people for their witness to him. When Paul wrote these words to Timothy; Rome was rarely not at war, their leaders were far worse than any presidents we have ever had and Timothy would be persecuted for his witness to Jesus. If Jesus and the Holy Spirit could give these individuals peace in such situations, what can the Lord do for us?

Yes there are scary things in the world. Yes bad nations and bad international actors are doing horrible things. One thing they can't do is take our peace if we abide in Jesus. What they can't do is thwart the will of God. What they can't do is delay the day when Jesus will return. Until that day, let us count our blessings, thank God for what we have been given and jealously guard the peace Jesus came to give us.

NIV "Pray continually"


CSB— "Pray constantly"

Many of the camps in the Upper Peninsula are having a very difficult time finding summer staff this year.

Do you know anyone who is looking for a summer job -- in the beautiful Upper Peninsula of Michigan, sharing Jesus' teachings in word and by example, along with hiking, canoeing, field games, crafts, baking, gaga ball, campfires, tent camping, etc.? We are asking that you please spread the word about the available jobs listed below. Pay is \$300/week plus room and board. (Cooking staff is more depending on the position)

Head Lifeguard/Kitchen Help - 1 position, age 21+. Currently certified in American Red Cross Waterfront.

**Head Lifeguard -** CPR/AED and First Aid. Supervision of waterfront activities, beach area and waterfront equipment. Oversee lifeguard staff, administer swim tests, provide basic swimming and water safety instruction, coordinate waterfront drills, assist with camp activities and in kitchen. May 30 - August 23.

Lifeguard/Kitchen Help - 1 position, age 18+. Currently certified in American Red Cross Waterfront

**Lifeguarding -** CPR/AED and First Aid. Assist head lifeguard in above waterfront activities, assist with camp activities and in kitchen. May 30- August 23

**Head Cook -** 1 position -age 21+. Responsible for kitchen and dining hall services, knowledge of nutritional requirements, proper food serving and kitchen procedures to meet state health and food service standards, menu planning and meal preparation including special dietary needs, food inventory and ordering within a budget. Kitchen management, organizational and supervisory skills. May 30-August 23.

**Second Cook** - 1 position,age 21+. Responsible for kitchen and dining hall services, knowledge of nutritional requirements, proper food serving and kitchen procedures to meet state health and food service standards, meal requirements, proper food serving and kitchen procedures to meet state health and food service standards, meal preparation including special dietary needs, kitchen management and supervisory skills. May 30 - August 23

**Assistant Cook -** 2 positions, age 18+. Responsible for food preparation and baking as directed by Head Cook following proper food handling techniques, clean -as-you-go in kitchen, dining hall, and dishes/pots and pans, prep and clean up of snacks and special foods, assist with inventory and other as directed by Head Cook. Responsible to assist with staff training and camper orientation presentations. Coordinate and support staff/volunteers and scheduling. Requires flexibility to adjust to new situations. **Counselor -** 4 male, 4 female counselors, age 19+. Requires strong leadership abilities, communication skills and Christian faith understanding, (with pre-camp staffing training) able to lead by positive example, facilitate outdoor and indoor games/activities, songs, crafts, Bible learning activities, prayer, and worship, oversee campers at all times for everyone's health and safety, assist in cleanliness of cabins and camp. May 30 - July 22. In addition, option to apply to guest camps for counselor positions from July 23 -August 15

**Custodial/Grounds/Maintenance** - 1 position, age 19+. Responsible for overall cleanliness of camp, including dining hall, bathhouses, and all buildings. Assist with grounds work, campfires, equipment and building repairs, garbage and recycling program, maintenance log and inventory. May 30 - Aug. 23.

Program staff live in residence at the camp and should be prepared to "live out of your suitcase" as housing location may change over the summer. In addition to salary, compensation includes room, board, and laundry facilities. Kitchen and custodial staff may live offsite and commute dependent on individual circumstances. 





PW has been busy in the kitchen over the last few months. The cabinets and drawers have all been sorted and relabeled to make it easier to find and put away all items. We have bought and replace two of the roasters, all of the cutting boards, two 20 quart stock pots, one 40 quart stock pot, two sauce pans with lids, added one 14 inch fry pan with lid, and for the grill two turners, one scraper, one press, and some new hot pads and gloves. We also purchased four larger carts. A flat grill top thermometer was donated by Alicia Cottle.

Instructions for the 18 quart roasters is posted over the roasters in the pantry. Two signs have been posted for use of the grill and range by the grill. The manuals for the range, grill, and other appliances, are in a folder in the cabinet above the coffee maker. The Public Health Department recently issued several new posters explaining food handling procedures and health safety issues that we all need to be aware of.


Make this heartwarming handprint gift to give your dad or another special man on Father's Day.
