This May contains two very important days in the Christian liturgical year. One of these is celebrated each year on Sunday, the Day of Pentecost. The Day of Pentecost is arguably the most important day of the Christian year. The Ascension of the Lord is also a very important day in the life of the church. The Ascension of the Lord falls this year on Thursday May 14th. We read the story of the ascension in Acts, (Acts 1:3-11 NIV): After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. {4} On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. {5} For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." {6} So when they met together, they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" {7} He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. {8} But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." {9} After he said

this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. {10} They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. {11} "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

There are some very interesting things we are told in this text. Jesus tells us he must fulfill the final act of his ministry. his ascension, for our good. Without his ascension the Holy Spirit will not be poured out on the world. To put it bluntly, without the ascension there is no Day of Pentecost which is arguably the most important day of the Christian year. Once Jesus has fulfilled all things with his ascension, he is then able to send the Holy Spirit which is God's promised presence with us ALWAYS. The gift of the Holy Spirit seals us as children of God. Jesus must ascend into heaven and take his rightful place to send the Holy Spirit. For this reason alone, we should be rejoicing in the Ascension of our Lord.

Our passage from Luke tells us another important mystery. Just before his

ascension, the apostles asked Jesus if he would restore the fortunes of Israel. He told them it was not for them to know when it was going to happen. Not for them to know what? The angels tell us. After Jesus ascended the apostles stood gazing at the sky and the angels told them, "Why do you look up at the sky, this Jesus who was taken from you will return in the same way." The apostles were asking Jesus about what we would call his second coming. When is Jesus going to return and put things right, usher in the Kingdom of God? Our passage leaves us with two certainties. It is not for us to know when. It is for us to know that Jesus will indeed return and set all things right. The Lord's Ascension paved the way for us to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and reminds us that, indeed, Jesus will return and make all things new. What a wonderful day it is.

Recently I wrote an article titled, "Where Is Honey." It was a story about "man's best friend," a dog named Honey. Honey and our tricolored Cocker Spaniel Abby met on the sidewalk near our home on East Portage, near our condominium. Honey and Abby appeared to get along well, rubbed noses, and seemed to want to play like they were puppies.

Abby was just over a year old, and Honey was nine. Every morning during the week Mark and Honey would meet up with us and our dogs looked forward to

their few minute get together. Then one day, Mark and Honey failed to come at the normal hour and we never saw them again.

The only thing I knew about Mark was that he lived east of us and he always walked westerly. I failed to get his name, or address and here all of a sudden I realized how important it is to get to know people, whether they are walking their dog, are your new neighbor, or friend which Mark and I had become in a short period of time.

When I ended my original article I said, "I hope all of us will acknowledge my mistake of not getting to know Mark better. When we seriously take these introductory steps, of getting to know someone, we will then learn where Honey is."

One of our church members, after reading the article, got busy trying to locate Mark, since he knew his parents. He visited them this past week and it just so happened that their son, Mark was also visiting them, and they called me, and I got to talk with Mark "Roe," who still lives east of me, on Portage across the street from the Elks Club.

I learned that Mark was laid off from his job on West Portage in the Industrial area during the business down turn of 2009. However, Mark was brought back to work seven months later, but his hours changed and mornings were not an option for walking Honey. Unfortunately, during this time, 12 year old Honey contracted cancer and within four months she died and joined other dogs where there are no fences and they can run and play forever.

While the story is somewhat sad, particularly if you are a dog lover, it does re-direct us with our behavior in accepting new acquaintances.

Since Bob Agar took the time to follow up, Mark Roe and I will seek to become friends for a life time. Maybe this summer, Mark, Abby, and I will do some kayaking and catch up on all that is happening in our community.







Make this beautiful craft to remind you of God's gift of new life at springtime.





What you need: 4


- White 11" x 17" paper
