



In 2015 we had more snow than anywhere snow was recorded in the United States, amounting to 156 inches. That was a lot of snow. I am sure in the high mountain areas where, it is not measured, there was more, but the Sault had the most in 2015.

Many years in my life I grew roses to exhibit always vying to win Queen of the Show. I never won Queen but every once in a while I would win King or Princess of the show.

You always knew how long we lived in the area by how many rose bushes we had. If we had 40 bushes we lived there for 1 year and in Wichita we had 160, so neighbors knew we had been there for 4 years.

We exhibited all over the mid west from Beaumont, Texas to Lincoln, Nebraska, because for every 100 miles north or south there was a week's difference in the growing season.

What this proves is that God is in control of the weather and in control of our lives.

A much needed rain is found in any storm cloud. As long as we have faith the showers will come and go.

Let us continue to look at the softening effect of life's rains. They are meaningful to each and every one of us. Get near to God and He will get near to you.

## SHAVING CREAM EARTH


God created this wonderful world and told us to care for it. Remember that by making a unique painting.

#### What you need:

- A cookie sheet
- White shaving cream
- A wooden craft stick
- Paint (blue and green)
- A straw
- A paper plate

#### What you do:

- 1. On the cookie sheet, spray shaving cream in a circle (the same size as the bottom of the paper plate). Smooth it out with the craft stick.
- 2. Squirt the blue and green paint on top of the shaving cream in loopy, squiggly patterns. Swirl the paint around with the straw.
- 3. Place the bottom of the paper plate on top of the paint. Press it down gently so the whole plate bottom is covered in paint.
- 4. Lift up the plate and gently remove excess shaving cream with the stick.
- 5. After the painting dries, hang it on your wall.
