This month is when we as Christians celebrate Holy Week. This is the defining time for Christianity. It is where our most recognized symbol, the cross, marks us as Christians. As part of the reformed church, we emphasize the empty cross. The reformed church points not so much to the suffering of Christ on the cross, but the resurrected Lord. This difference in focus is meaningful. The empty cross symbolizes God's ability to take pain, suffering and evil itself and transform it into something wonderful, amazing, salvation for the world. Paul writes about this in his letter to the Romans 8:31-39:

What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us? {32} He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all--how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? {33} Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. {34} Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus, who died--more than that, who was raised to life--is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. $\{35\}$ who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? {36} As it is written: "For your sake we

face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered." {37} No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. {38} For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, {39} neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Paul explains that Jesus' resurrection is God's promise to us that God's victory is not a small one. God doesn't just win a victory over sin and death by a razor's margin. God's victory is so large, so massive, and so comprehensive we are caught up in it. It manifests in our lives here and now and becomes fully manifest in eternity. These are the promises of the Easter season.

Our Maundy Thursday service is on the 14th at 7:00. We will have a potluck before the service at 6:00. Before the Easter Service we will have an Easter Breakfast from 9:00-9:45.

MAIN REGISTRATION FORM - MANDATORY AND **AVAILABLE ON FEBRUARY 14TH, 2022** You will be asked to fill out basic information including your address, contact information, and preferred week of camp for your camper. Have more than one child? You will need to fill out a separate form for each.

MEDICAL FORM - MANDATORY (we will email/mail you this form spring 2022) You will be asked to provide basic medical information for each child, including: their medications, medical history, immunization history (dates), primary doctor/dentist, and insurance information.

We do ask that any child who has a chronic health concern, activity restrictions, or has undergone surgery within 3 months of their camp session bring a note from your healthcare provider sign-off. This will need to be completed by a licensed medical professional and brought to camp on registration day.

Does your child have a preferred cabinmate? Please indicate so on your form. We do our very best to honor all cabin requests. Both campers must be in the same program. We do not guarantee all requests.






