Pastor's Message

On Sunday I heard a really good children's sermon. It encouraged us to be thankful for all the gifts we have in our lives. I started thinking immediately about the music we have had in our worship services. Last year we shut down our services due to COVID. When we opened back up there were a lot of questions. One of the things I have been thankful for is the music that has been part of our worship services. We have been fortunate to have individuals who have given their time, effort and talents to lift us in the worship of God. I know it has been very important for me.

We have also been fortunate to have good leadership throughout this period. The Trustees spent a lot of time in research and discussions about how to open back up safely. Session has also spent a good deal of time weighing when and how to remove various restrictions. Church members have also been great in terms of working together in a time where differences of opinion could have caused problems. With the amount of information about COVID and sometimes conflicting interpretation of the information, it is not surprising sharp and intense differences have occurred between people in our society.

I am very thankful for the way our membership has handled the challenges over the past two years. Speaking of moving forward, the news has brought us more scare media lately concerning COVID. There is a new push to return to masks. We are not going backwards in this regard, because it doesn't follow the science. Here is the good

news, every scientific study shows that if you have received both doses of the vaccine you do not need to wear masks. If you have been vaccinated, you are not only protected from the original COVID but all the scary variants in the news. So there is no reasons to mask for the sake of the vaccinated. For those who are unvaccinated, scientific studies show about half of those unvaccinated in America have the antibodies. This means they had COVID and got over it. These individuals have the same immunities as the vaccinated. studies show those who had COVID and recovered are not a threat to others the same way the vaccinated are not a threat.

So that leaves those who are not vaccinated and do not have the antibodies. Should we mask for them? First, those who are either vaccinated or got COVID and recovered are not a threat to them according to the science. So, no need for them to mask. What about those who are not vaccinated and don't have the antibodies, are they a danger to each other? Yes and that is why the cases are growing in this group. So we should mask for them? Again, those who are vaccinated or possess antibodies are not a threat to them. As for those who are not vaccinated and don't have the antibodies, should they mask to help each other? At the beginning of the pandemic when it was thought that infection was mainly through contact on surfaces or water droplets expelled during respiration, it made sense to

Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:


- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - **white** = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - **red** = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - **black** = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver




Teach us to pray
