Life is sometimes a rollercoaster ride. Other times life can seem like a grind, a lot of responsibilities and little fun or me time. Our spiritual lives can be the same. There are times we feel our spirits soar and at other times we are in the dark night of the soul. Still at other times, we feel neither heights nor depths, but a general malaise. It happens to all or at least most of us.

(Rev 1:9-20 NIV) I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. {10} On the Lord's Day I was in the Spirit, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet, {11} which said: "Write on a scroll what you see and send it to the seven churches: to Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicea." {12} I turned around to see the voice that was speaking to me. And when I turned I saw seven golden lampstands, {13} and among the lampstands was someone "like a son of man," dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest. {14} His head and hair were white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire. {15} His feet were like bronze glowing in a

furnace, and his voice was like the sound of rushing waters. {16} In his right hand he held seven stars, and out of his mouth came a sharp double-edged sword. His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance. {17} When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. {18} I am the Living One; I was dead, and behold I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades. {19} "Write, therefore, what you have seen, what is now and what will take place later. {20} The mystery of the seven stars that you saw in my right hand and of the seven golden lampstands is this: The seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

The apostle John was very old at this point, much, much older than people generally lived in his day and even old in our day. This is long after Jesus called him, he followed Jesus into the halls of Pilate when Jesus was sentenced, the tongues of fire and the day of Pentecost and his ministry and miracles to at least three generations of Christians in the early Church. John had been through a lot and he had done even more. Yet how does Christ appear to him? (Continued on page 2)






Scrip cards helps to make your gift giving easy! We have over 600 places we can order from. Scrip purchasing is easy and does





When you read Psalm 100 it says, "Shout praises to the Lord, everyone on this earth. Be joyful and sing as you come in to worship the Lord! You know the Lord is God!" He created us, and we belong to him; we are his people, the sheep in his pasture. Be thankful and praise the Lord as you enter his temple. The Lord is good! His love and faithfulness will last forever. Praise be to God the Almighty!


CROUP TO
