Pastor's Message

Don't look now, but Lent is almost upon us. Can you believe it? Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is on February 14th. It just seems like it was Christmas and now we are knocking on the door of Lent. To celebrate Ash Wednesday, we will have a Lenten meal provided by the deacons at 6 pm and a service at 7 pm. But what is the Lenten season?

Lent is a period of 40 days stretching from Ash Wednesday to Easter. If one looks at the calendar and counts the days, then there are more than 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Here is one of the mysteries of Lent. The Sundays of Lent are not included in the 40 days? But Why?

Lent is closely tied to the period in Jesus' ministry where after being baptized he went and spent 40 days and night in the wilderness. The shortest Gospel account of this period comes from Mark 1:9-13, "9 In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. 11 And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." 12 And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the

wilderness. 13 He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him."

After his baptism Jesus went into the wilderness. Why? We are simply told "The Spirit drove him out into the wilderness." Many books could be written to answer the question of "What exactly does this mean?" For our purposes, it means it was God's plan for him to enter the wilderness for these 40 days and nights. So why did God want him to enter the wilderness? It tells us Satan tempted him during this period. It was Satan's first shot to really mess things up and stop the salvation of humankind. This was a period of testing for Jesus.

This particular passage is associated with Lent, because Lent is a time for us to consider where we are being "tempted" in our lives. What are the areas of our life where we could do better by others and God? What is preventing us or stopping us from doing better? These are the kinds of questions we as Christians are supposed to be pondering during Lent. It is a time for the examination of the soul.

None of this yet explains why Sundays are not counted among the 40 days

What is the Endowment Fund of the First United Presbyterian Church?

For all those who attended and enjoyed the Christmas dinner after the Cantata, how many of us are aware that the Endowment Fund which not only paid for the food but prepared, served and cleaned up with some able help from old and new Trustees.

What is this Endowment Fund. This was a separate fund of money commenced in 1983 for the purpose of creating permanent investments to provide financial stability going forward into the future. The by-laws were updated in 1997. There are also guidelines in the types of investments the committee may make.

The Endowment Fund is invested by a committee made up of church members who have expertise in the area of investment. The members are appointed by the Board of Trustees. Income created by the fund may be used for any non-ongoing expenses of the Church. The funds are not to be used for ordinary operating expenses but special needs. Only income may be used and not all income can be used, 10 percent is put back into the permanent fund to guard against inflation and maintain fund stability.

The current members are Ron Meister, Richard Brawley, James Bourque, Bill Krempel and Dan Reattoir.

Most recently the Endowment Fund provided the funding for the purchase of the Church's third rental home on Lyon Street. Past projects have been substantial. In 2017 the replacement windows and siding on a rental house were funded at \$23,305. In 2018 the Endowment Fund will pay approximately \$10,000. For a special assessment for Lyon Street improvements.

In 2011, \$16,000.00 was advanced for repairs on the Norton house. Recently the purchase of a third rental was financed by the Endowment fund.

During the rebuilding of the church after the fire the Endowment covered all interest payments on funds borrowed to finalize construction.

Currently to date the Endowment Fund has contributed \$471,628. For extraordinary non-ongoing Church expenses.

Contributions in lieu of memorial funds are welcomed as are any other contributions. The Endowment Fund has contributed to the ongoing and future financial stability of our Church and for this we owe a debt of gratitude for the founding of this fund.
