# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

When is bad news, really bad news? Well, there certainly seems to be a lot of bad news. Just turn on any of the 24 hour news channels, open a paper or go on line and the amount of bad news can be depressing. We Christians are pre-programmed to look for bad news. Jesus' words have echoed down the centuries, "(Mat 24:21-27 NIV) For then there will be great distress, unequaled from the beginning of the world until now--and never to be equaled again. {22} If those days had not been cut short, no one would survive, but for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened. {23} At that time if anyone says to you, 'Look, here is the Christ!' or, 'There he is!' do not believe it. {24} For false christs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and miracles to deceive even the elect--if that were possible. {25} See, I have told you ahead of time. {26} "So if anyone tells you, 'There he is, out in the desert,' do not go out; or, 'Here he is, in the inner rooms,' do not believe it. {27} For as lightning that comes from the east is visible even in the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man."

We are programmed as Christians to look for Jesus' return when things get bad. Current events certainly look bad. The Middle East that is the focal point of so

many of the Biblical end time prophecies is filled with strife. The terror group ISIS has taken many towns and cities. Our Christian brothers and sisters flee wherever ISIS gains control as ISIS believes in murdering Christians. The factions fighting ISIS are Shia Islamic militias with ties to Iran who likewise believe in killing Christians. Christians are suffering more in parts of the Middle East today than in any time in recorded history.

Besides strife in the Middle East there is constant news about disasters: floods, droughts, earthquakes, etc. Things certainly look bad. Maybe history is winding down; maybe Jesus' return is near. So what can we do? Jesus encourages us to always be ready, "(Mat 24:42-44 NIV) "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. {43} But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. {44} So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him." Just as the servant who knows his master is returning soon will make ready for the master, we are called as Christians to make sure we are ready at (Continued on page 2)

My father was a wonderful example for me and I loved him very much. My Dad spent a limited time in college and began working for Sinclair Oil and Gas, whose world headquarters was located in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Even with his lack of a college degree, but he was one of the smartest men I have known. He read three books a week for fifty years, became Director of Personnel and Safety. He taught me loyalty as he spent forty two years with Sinclair.

He graduated in 1927 twenty five years ahead of me from the same high school, Tulsa Central High. He was an honor student, was in class plays, state oratorical champion having defeated Carl Albert, who a few years later became the Democratic Whip of the House of Representatives in Washington, D.C. They kept their relationship over the years and contacted one another from time to time.

Dad could work a cross word puzzle in little time, and other executives with Sinclair would call him and ask him about certain sentences on which they were stumped. He always had the answer.

One time when one of our daughters was visiting mom and dad in their home on the St. John's River after they re-located to Florida. During her visit she asked Dad to recite the poem, "The Highwayman" which takes about twenty minutes to recite. After he completed the poem, she asked him how long had been since he had

memorized this high school poem? He had memorized the rearing of children just like it sixty some years in high school.

wrote about the importance of So, what can fathers pass on to you? I know what he passed on to me. He passed on loyalty, responsibility, telling the truth, thinking and acting like a man, and the necessary prerequisites to being a good father. Good fathers are ones who have learned to lean on the Lord. Proverbs says "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him and he shall direct thy paths."

> Dad was the one I grabbed onto along with my stay at home Mom. My older sister and I were close but nothing like the relationship I had with my father. Fathers have to follow their own dreams and so did I. as I was the first person in our family to graduate from college in 1956, with a B.S. in Business Administration, and a Marketing degree in Marketing.

> College allowed me to complete twenty seven years with Republic Steel when they merged with Jones and Laughlin Steel to for LTV Steel, the second largest steel company in the free world. Two years later, LTV was filing for bankruptcy. My career didn't end in 1984 because I became the "father" to several ladies for twenty one years at LSSU, as their Head Women's Softball Coach. My athletic background (baseball) prepared me softball since we had only one son but three girls, one of which was a pretty good softball player at St. Agatha, in the Detroit area. You never know where your dreams will take you but being a father and celebrating Father's Day is dream and a wish your heart makes.



Our scrip program is well under way and we are fundraising without even trying! Scrip is super easy and does not cost you any extra money. Nor do you have to buy things you don't need! We placed our first order in May and it was received within 6 days! Our order total was just about \$1200 and the church made \$36! How cool is that. Soup Kitchen and PW are on board and helped support the first order! So all of our church organizations can utilize it! We will be doing orders the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. You may bring your orders in to the office at any time and or place them with Brenda. Orders do need to be paid in advance.

What is scrip you might ask? Scrip is the opportunity to purchase gift cards for face value from our scrip program at the church. We deal with Great Lakes Scrip. So when we place our order, the cards are purchased at a "discount" and the church receives that in to their fundraising account. For example: If you purchase a GFS card for \$25, you still pay \$25, but the church pays \$24 and keeps the \$1 to put in the fund. Each business offers

different percentages back and it can range from 2% to 15% for some. There are over 600 different places available to purchase from all the way from Amazon to Holiday Gas, Walmart to Walgreens, and even Dairy Queen! The best part is that it does not cost you or the church extra money. It just requires a little bit of pre planning on your part, but once you get in the habit, it is so easy!

If you have any questions, feel welcome to connect with Brenda, check the church website for a link, or read the information on the board in the hall by the office. Again, this is a super way to help raise money and not over ask our members!






