(Psa 19:1-11 NIV) For the director of music. A psalm of David. The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. {2} Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge. {3} There is no speech or language where their voice is not heard. {4} Their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world. In the heavens he has pitched a tent for the sun, {5} which is like a bridegroom coming forth from his pavilion, like a champion rejoicing to run his course. {6} It rises at one end of the heavens and makes its circuit to the other; nothing is hidden from its heat. {7} The law of the LORD is perfect, reviving the soul. What Does That Mean?

Called Minister: A Called Minister is the minister/pastor that holds a permanent position in the church.

Stated Supply Minister: A Stated Supply Minister is a minister of the word and sacrament appointed by the presbytery, after consultation with the session, that fills a temporary position at a church. A temporary supply may be any of the following: a candidate under care of a presbytery, a minister of the word and sacrament, a Commissioned Ruling Elder, or an elder. There is no mandatory limit to the term of a temporary supply contract, however, it will normally be for no more than twelve months and be renewable for no more than twelve months at a time.

Interim: An interim pastor is a minister of the word and sacrament who is invited by the local Session with approval of presbytery to fill the positions of interim pastor, interim co-pastor, or interim associate pastor under circumstances described in the Book of Order. An interim is often brought into a church while that congregation is looking for a new permanent minister. The interim contract is for no more than twelve months and may be renewed for a period of not more than twelve months at a time with approval of the *Commission on Ministry* of the presbytery.

Pulpit Supply: A person who comes in to perform designated functions for a specific worship service. They act as the minister for that service only. This is done when the Called Minister is on vacation or otherwise unavailable.

How is the First United Presbyterian Church of Sault Sainte Marie, Michigan Organized?

Greetings. Last month I shared with you the upper level organization of our church under PCUSA. Inadvertently this link was left out of the Chimes article:

Our Office of the Presbytery is the Presbytery of Mackinac and is located in Petoskey, Michigan and can be found online at https://www.presbymac.org/

This month I will show how the local congregation is organized by our Constitution which contains two parts. Part I contains primarily matters of faith and Part II handles the "polity" (or governmental) matters as defined in the <u>Book of Order</u>. This link will take you to the latest version on the PCUSA website and there are currently 322 pages of reading available |(for effective sedation, if needed.) Because it is a detailed document I will only cite excerpts from one of the four sections:

F - The Foundations of Presbyterian Polity

G - Form of **G**overnment

W - Directory for Worship

D - Rules of Discipline

For our current discussion of the organization of our church, we are interested in section **G** which is divided into 6 Chapters:

- 1 Congregations and Their Membership
- 2 Ordered Ministry, Commissioning, and Certification
- 3 Councils of the Church
- 4 The Church and Civil Authority
- **5** Ecumenicity and Union
- 6 Interpreting and Amending the Constitution

SESSION

In section **G-1.0103**:

The members of a congregation put themselves under the leadership of the session and the higher councils (presbytery, synod, and General Assembly). The session is responsible to guide and govern the life of the congregation. The session leads the congregation in fulfilling its responsibilities for the service of all people, for the upbuilding of the whole church, and for the glory of God.

DEACON

In section G-2.02:

The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress.

In section **G-2.0201**:

Deacons may be individually commissioned or organized as a board of deacons. In either case, their ministry is under the supervision and authority of the session.

RULING ELDER

In section **G-2.0301**:

Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the session.

MINISTERS OF THE WORD AND SACRAMENT

In section **G-2.0501**:

Ministers of the Word and Sacrament (also called teaching elders and pastors) shall in all things be committed to teaching the faith in word and deed and equipping the saints for the work of ministry (Eph. 4:12). They may serve in a variety of ministries, as authorized by the presbytery.

TRUSTEES

In section **G-4.0101**:


Where permitted by civil law, each congregation shall cause a corporation to be formed and maintained. If incorporation is not permitted, individual trustees shall be elected by the congregation.

Also in section **G-4.0101**:

The corporation so formed, or the Individual trustees, shall have the following powers: to receive, hold, encumber, manage, and transfer property, real or personal, for the congregation, provided that in buying, selling, and mortgaging real property, the trustees shall act only after the approval of the congregation, granted in a duly constituted meeting; to accept and execute deeds of title to such property; to hold and defend title to such property; to manage any permanent special funds for the furtherance of the purposes of the congregation, all subject to the authority of the session and under the provisions of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The powers and duties of the trustees shall not infringe upon the powers and duties of the session or the board of deacons.

Well, that is a lot to digest and only a small part of The Book of Order. Next month we will try to start discussing the Church Committees.






Rummage Sale


