Pastor's Message

Awhile back, session was approached with a request to purchase an AED machine. What is an AED machine? AED stands for "Automated External Defibrillator". It is a device that can check heart rhythm and if need be send a shock to the heart to restore rhythm. It is used in the case of sudden cardiac arrest. It is automated, so it won't send a shock unless the person needs it. In certain situations, the sooner this can be used on a person the more likely it will lead to a better outcome.

It sounded like a very good idea to session. A big thank you to the individuals who did a lot of the legwork on what we needed and how much it would cost. A member was also able to get us a \$500 gift from War Memorial Hospital toward the purchase. The total cost is ~\$2000. We already have the \$500 donation from War Memorial Hospital, this leaves us short ~\$1500. The Session is asking the congregations for donations to allow this purchase to happen.

In the spirit of the month let us remember to give thanks to God for all the blessings we have received. James 1:17-18, "17 Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. 18 He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of all he created." God has richly blessed us. During this month of thanksgiving, let us make sure we take time to praise and thank God for all we have and for what Christ had done for us.



Psalm 100:4






Quilt Raffle
