Pastor's Message

What a year 2020 has been. The events of 2020 have been the subject of jokes, sighs and tears. Great ideological battles have been fought, passions ignited, roars among the nations and disease spread across our globe. Shouts of Panic! and Fear! have been trumpeted from our news sources. Loved ones have been lost. Fevered orators have laid claim to our loyalties lest their movements fail to save the world.

What does the Bible say about all this? First, the Bible does tell us things will change one day in ways we cannot even conceive. This change will not come from Trump or Bidden, Republicans or Democrats, BLM or Patriot groups. The Bible tells us it will come from God. Revelation 21:5-7 tells us this very clearly:

SIMPLE SYMBOLS

Create personalized initial ornaments for family and friends.




What you need:

- Small twigs (various shapes and sizes)
- Hot glue
- Yarn
- Scissors
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. After gathering twigs, arrange them to create uppercase letter shapes. Cross, bend and break twigs, as needed.
- 2. Glue "letters" together at the intersections.
- 3. Cut an arm-length of yarn and wind it around twigs to add color to each letter.
- 4. Create a loop of yarn and tie it to the top of the ornament for hanging.
