

Power in weakness

In the late 1970s, Henry Smith was struggling to find work after finishing his education. He also lived with a degenerative disease that caused him to become legally blind. But one day he heard a pastor explain that Jesus became poor so we might become rich through him. This idea inspired Smith to craft a song of thanks for God's gift of Jesus. Though Smith wrote more than 300 songs, only this one became widely known labeled "author unknown" (sometimes or misattributed, but finally rightfully credited to him).

"Give thanks with a grateful heart," the song begins exuberantly. One of its most poignant lines urges, "Let the weak say, I am strong ... because of what the Lord has done for us." Across two millennia, Smith's words and faith echo the apostle Paul: "[The Lord] said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me" (2 Corinthians 12:9, NRSV).

October Mission Project


During the month of October the Women's Wednesday Bible Study group is asking



Backpacks- can be used, underwear, socks, slippers, and adult coloring or puzzle books.


* No toiletries are needed, as ARC is able to provide these.

God's Word tells us to help those in need, and your donations to this project are doing that. Thank you again for your generosity and prayers; may God bless you for sharing with those in need in our community.











and if you can help in any way it would be greatly appreciated. Please call Alegra – 632-3972.


Our Bazaar is the major source of funding for our church missions. We need your support NOW.
