Pastor's Message

Ecclesiastes has some very interesting passages. Such as this one in chapter 1:7-11

7All streams flow into the sea, yet the sea is never full. To the place the streams come from, there they return again.

8All things are wearisome, more than one can say. The eye never has enough of seeing, nor the ear its fill of hearing.

9What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun.

10Is there anything of which one can say, "Look! This is something new"?

It was here already, long ago; it was here before our time.

11No one remembers the former generations, and even those yet to come will not be remembered by those who follow them

The author of Ecclesiastes was obsessed with the big picture. He wanted to know how everything worked and what the future would hold. Upon applying his great wisdom to the task, he came to some answers that didn't thrill him. He was a cog in a huge machine. The rules that applied to everyone else applied to him even with his great knowledge. There was no escape from the cycles of nature or the wheel of birth, life and death.

And God, his wisdom told him God would be sovereign. There was no fighting God and if one did only bitterness would follow. The best he could do is bend the knee to God, live the life God assigned him and try to find some fun along the way. While his message maybe a tad on the morbid side, he does have a point. Worrying about things we can't control or change does us no good.

What has been will be again, we can't change that. Trying just wastes the opportunities we are afforded to have fun and find enjoyment in life. In Christ we are promised so much more than the author of Ecclesiastes could see with his great wisdom. How much more should




BACKPACK BLESSING





What you do:


